Our media statements will appear on a case by case basis in response to specific articles. As we previously provided point by point feedback to you in the draft of your report that you shared with us, we will not reiterate those facts and perspectives. While, the CLW report deals with issues that we both acknowledge as critical, we were disappointed with the CLW report for its single company focus rather than industry approach, the selective use of facts and the inclusion of information that was factually incorrect or simply assertions without substantiation.

Despite our substantively different views about the report, BVCPS encourages CLW to continue to provide any details of allegations related to BVCPS auditors. BVCPS will continue to undertake an investigation of each incident and respond to all credible allegations consistent with the BVCPS zero tolerance policy.
